The project

The Twelve Apostles Trail is a proposed 38km extension of the Camperdown to Timboon Rail Trail from Timboon to Port Campbell (stage 1) and from Port Campbell to Princetown (stage 2).

The project has been assessed and the trail route detailed as part of a 2007 Trail Assessment Study funded by BHP Billiton.

The Twelve Apostles Trail has the support of land managers and the relevant committees of management.

Why it makes sense

Our regional tourism growth is inhibited by a pattern of visitation that is vehicle dependent, short stay and concentrated on the coast

The Twelve Apostles Trail can change this pattern by directly meeting 'an increasing demand for active, environmentally sustainable tourism experiences and modes of transport'* as well as contributing to the long term health of the community and viability of the tourism industry.

How will it benefit local communities?

- Active travel and recreation opportunities contribute to community health and well being. It is estimated 10,000 Corangamite residents will live within 5km of the extended (completed) trail.
- · A completed trail will stimulate investment in local economies and encourage business development, new businesses and services aligned with the trail and trail users.
- A trail from Camperdown to Princetown will connect five Corangamite Shire townships to 67km of safe walk and ride opportunities and assist to spread tourism benefit beyond the Twelve Apostles.
- · A connective trail beyond the Great Ocean Walk into Port Campbell positions both Princetown and Port Campbell as overnight stops connected to a Great Ocean Walk experience.

Good sense makes dollars!

- Trail users will stay longer, spend more and travel more widely in the region. Bicycle visitors spend on average 53% more in regions they visit than traditional visitors¹
- The extended trail will enhance the experience at one of Australia's premier visitor destinations (Port Campbell National Park) contributing to more 'whole trail traffic' and an increase in overnight stays.
- The Trail Assessment Study estimates the completed trail will deliver an economic benefit of \$1-\$5 million dollars per annum based on comparable case studies.
- The estimated total expenditure of cycle tourists in Australia in 2010 was estimated at \$2.4 billion dollars²
