WIND TO BRING RISK AND RELIEF

Strong northerly winds forecast for the region in the middle of the week could be a double-edged sword. While wind may dissipate smoke and gas emissions from the peat fires, they can also increase the threat of fire. Forecast showers and lower temperatures will alleviate some risk but residents are encouraged to follow usual precautions as the fire danger period continues. FIREFIGHTING CONTINUES

A four-kilometre pipeline from the Ewen Hill Reservoir to the Cobrico peat fire has been completed. It will operate 24 hours a day and provide substantially more water which crews will be able to pump water directly onto the peat fire.

PEAT SMOKE INHALATION

Community members are encouraged to stay away from areas heavily affected by the smoke from the peat fires and to monitor air quality by visiting www.epa.vic.gov.au.

If you are within 1-6 km of the peat smoke plume, avoid outdoor physical activity. Community members within 1 km of the fire are encouraged to get their carbon monoxide levels tested regularly at the Terang Relief Centre or Camperdown Hospital.

Those with symptoms that may be due to smoke exposure can visit the Community Health Assessment Centre between 8am and 8pm at the Terang Relief Centre, 129 High Street, Terang.

If community members have concerns about their carbon monoxide levels overnight, they can visit the Terang Hospital.

If you are leaving smoke-affected areas for longer periods, please fill in an Absence of Residence form at the Terang Relief Centre.

COMMUNITY MEETING

A public meeting will be held at the Terang Recreation Reserve from 7 pm-10 pm on Wednesday 11 April. Formalities will run from 8 pm-8:30 pm followed by the opportunity to ask questions of Victoria Police, the Environment Protection Authority, BlazeAid, the Department of Health and Human Services, Victorian Farmers Federation, Victorian Council of Churches, Wannon Water, Agriculture Victoria and WestVic Dairy. Ambulance Victoria will conduct health assessments.

LIVESTOCK

Landholders with animals in the vicinity of the ongoing peat fires should take every effort to minimise exposure to smoke.

Animals generally tolerate smoke well, but some may exhibit minor respiratory problems or eye irritation.

Veterinary advice should be sought if animal owners are concerned their animals are being affected by smoke or ash.

IF YOUR TANK WATER IS CONTAMINATED

If you live in a bushfire-affected area your drinking water tank could have become contaminated from debris, ash, dead animals or aerial fire retardants.

If the water tastes, looks or smells unusual, do not drink it or give it to animals.

Use bottled water for drinking, cooking, brushing teeth et cetera until tanks can be cleaned and refilled.

Contact **Wannon Water on 1300 926 666** to flush clean and refill your tanks.

Wannon Water will arrange for a water carter to refill the tanks with potable water.

This will be one 14,000L load per household, unless specific circumstances require more.

Town water is not affected.

Contact Council if your stock water has been used for firefighting and needs replacement.
