FARM HOUSEHOLD ALLOWANCE

Farmers whose livelihood has been disrupted by the fires may now qualify for Farm Household Allowance.

The Federal Government scheme provides:

a fortnightly payment comparable to Newstart for up to three years

a Farm Household Case Officer to help you improve your financial circumstances

an Activity Supplement worth up to \$4000 for study, training or professional advice to help improve your financial position

You can discuss your eligibility at the Australian Government Mobile Service Centres or from a Rural Call Centre by calling the Farmer Assistance hotline on 132 316.

The hotline staff are experienced and knowledgeable about issues that affect rural families and farming businesses.

MOBILE SERVICE CENTRE

Australian Government Mobile Service Centres travel to rural and regional communities to provide personalised, face-to-face services. Department of Human Services staff travel with the Mobile Service Centres and can help with Centrelink, Medicare, Child Support and Australian Hearing payments and services.

TREE ASSISTANCE

Please contact Council on 5593 7100 if you have concerns about trees.

Council can:

- Provide native vegetation assessments for fence re-establishment:
- Undertake the removal of trees overhanging boundary fences where they are adjoining a road reserve or crown land; and
- Provide advice on other trees and particularly native vegetation within your property however the removal and clean-up of trees will be the responsibility of the property owner

If you believe a tree within your property is a hazard you should ensure the area around the tree is avoided until it can be made safe. Council can assist you if you are unsure if a tree on your property is hazardous.

The removal of trees and particularly cypress and pine plantations within private property are the responsibility of the property owner. There is currently no funding for these works however Council are working with a range of agencies to determine if financial support may be available to landowners for these works.

FARM PLANNING SUPPORT

If you require confidential farm business analysis support then please contact **Rural Financial Counselling (RFCS) on**

1300 735 578. They will come to you.

The service can assist you with accessing grants, claiming insurance, analysing your current financial situation and planning for your future. It will help you find the support you need.

RFCS support is free, personalised and ongoing until you get back on your feet.

LIVESTOCK

Landholders with animals in the vicinity of the ongoing peat fires should take every effort to minimise exposure to smoke.

Animals generally tolerate smoke well, but some may exhibit minor respiratory problems or eye irritation.

Veterinary advice should be sought if animal owners are concerned their animals are being affected by smoke or ash.

Further information on the management of livestock following an emergency and pets and smoke go to agriculture.vic.gov.au/agriculture/emergencies/recovery/bushfires-in-south-west-victoria/.

Farmers with affected livestock can contact **Agriculture Victoria on 5336 6721.** An Animal Health Team will visit properties to assess damage and provide advice.

If you need fodder for your livestock, contact **Victorian Farmers Federation on 1300 882 833.**

For help disposing of dead livestock, contact **Corangamite Shire on 5593 7100.**

If any livestock are still alive but injured beyond treatment, the owner can **call Victorian Petfood Processors on 5593**1986 to have the animal collected and destroyed at no cost.

IF YOUR TANK WATER IS CONTAMINATED

If you live in a bushfire-affected area your drinking water tank could have become contaminated from debris, ash, dead animals or aerial fire retardants.

If the water tastes, looks or smells unusual, do not drink it or give it to animals. Use bottled water for drinking, cooking, brushing teeth et cetera until tanks can be cleaned and refilled. Contact **Council on 5593 7100** to flush clean and refill your tanks.
