FIRE RESTRICTIONS LIFTED

Fire Restrictions have now been lifted and burning off is permitted across Corangamite Shire.

As a result there may be an increase in smoke as people commence burning. Please be aware that you may also see fires in paddocks as people begin to burn larger heaps.

If you are concerned, however, please call 000.

We also ask that residents who are burning take care, burn responsibly and safely, and register any major burn offs by calling 1800 668 511.

FIRE SUPPRESSION ACTIVITIES

The Incident Management Team has completed its relocation from Warrnambool Incident Control Centre and is now situated at the Cobden Fire Station in Station Street Cobden. Enquiries can be directed through the reception via telephone on 5595 2345.

HEAT SPOT MONITORING

Aircrews continue to monitor for heat spots at both Elingamite and Cobrico.

As of today, no heat has been detected for the past 11 days both from aerial inferred detection and in ground heat monitoring methods.

Over the coming days, crews will begin the retrieval of fire-fighting equipment along with fire-fighting hose within the peat area. The main pipe line will remain until further notice.

The Cobden ICC will remain open until further notice with crews continuing to monitor and rehabilitate affected areas.

AIR MONITORING

Carbon Monoxide (CO) monitoring results from the three Environment Protection Authority (EPA) sites at Cobden, Lake Cobrico and Lake Elingamite are returning values well below health trigger levels. The EPA plans to decommission the air monitoring sites in the coming weeks. The monitoring site at Cobden, which monitors a larger area, will remain and continue monitoring until further notice.
