WestVic Dairy Farm Recovery Coordinator Dairy Helen Chenoweth said the event was part of the SW Industry Liaison Group's response to the fires.

FIRE RELIEF FUNDRAISER

FIRE DEBRIEFINGS

Emergency Management Victoria is holding community debriefing sessions that allow members of the community to contribute information specific to what worked and what can be improved.

The focus is on allowing people to come into a welcoming environment, share their perspective which can help EMV determine what to do next. So far, debriefs have been held at the Killara Centre in Camperdown on 17 May, Cobden Civic Hall on 21 May and Terang Civic Hall on 24 May.

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APPLY FOR YOUR \$10,000 GRANT

FIRE-affected farmers can apply for grants of up to \$10,000 and concessional interest rate loans of up to \$200,000.

The joint Australian, state and territory governments' Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements (NDRRA) provide a range of financial assistance to the natural disaster-declared areas.

People affected by the South West Complex Fire March 2018 may be eligible for personal hardship and distress assistance, personal and financial counselling, funding to remove debris from residential properties to make them safe and habitable, demolition or rebuilding to restore housing to a habitable condition, counter disaster operations and restoration of essential public assets.

Concessional interest rate loans are available for eligible primary producers in the affected area.

Recovery grants of up to \$10,000 are available for eligible primary producers in the three [3] local government areas of Corangamite, Moyne and Southern Grampians.

ACT NOW FOR FARMERS' FUND GRANTS

FARMERS have until 31 May to apply for this round of the VFF's Farmers' Fund dairy farmer grants.

Priority will be given to dairy farmers impacted by the recent fires in the south west of the state.

COMMUNITY RELIEF FUND

The South West Victorian Community Relief Fund committee is working on criteria for the distribution of funds.

Bendigo Bank State Community Manager Keith McQueen said the fund would be used to help people not helped by other avenues. He said the committee was working to identify gaps in existing funding so it could support those people.

"We would hope that in a month or so the criteria will be set, Mr McQueen said. "Support from across the state and the country has been really strong, particularly in the region.

"We are very grateful to those people who have contributed."

INSURANCE CLAIMS PRIORITISED

INSURANCE claims stemming from the South West Complex Fire March 2018 will be given priority by insurers after the Insurance Council of Australia (ICA) declared a catastrophe.

Claims from affected policyholders will be ranked to direct urgent attention to the worst-affected property owners.

ICA staff are working directly with local services and affected policyholders.
