The fire at Terang and Cobden is now contained.

Firefighters have been able to stop the spread of the fire.

There is currently no threat to communities, but you should continue to stay informed and monitor conditions.

Smoke will continue to be visible from nearby communities and roads, this is not related to increased fire activity, however it could relate to burning peat across a number of locations within the fire area. Peat fires smoulder for a longer time. A fact sheet is available on the DHHS website (www2.health.vic.gov.au) with details about peat fire smoke.
