P12 RESILIENCE WIN

Timboon P-12 TAP (Timboon Agricultural Program) has been kicking goals. The program was a highlight at this year's Disaster Resilient Australian-New Zealand School Education Forum in Melbourne. The forum provides insight for schools to build resilience in their students especially around disasters.

At Timboon P-12 the TAP builds partnerships between agriculture and curriculum to enhance student learning. Natural Disaster is a part of living on farm and the focus of the Year 6 students each year. Besides understanding what causes natural disasters, such as bushfires and floods, the students incorporate probability of a natural disaster impacting a property in math's class along with mapping their own farm and home to create a bushfire survival plans.

Students also calculate the cost to replace fences and laneway damage from flood waters, then determine insurance eligibility and grants eligibility. These projects include local farmers discussing their own impacts from flood and fire as well as the CFA, SES and ambulance imparting their knowledge. Students are engaged and involved in past emergencies in the area and explore how to live in an environment where natural hazards occur.

EVENTS GRANTS

'Look Over the Farm Gate' is a wellbeing initiative which provides grants for one-off events or a series of events. It encourages rural communities to look out for one another, promote social inclusion, and create awareness about mental health, thus reducing the impact on rural communities. Events can range from regular fitness meet-ups, free community barbecues, community tree planting or a family movie night – whatever your community needs to come together and take a break. SW BUSHFIRE APPEAL

The final distribution from the South West Bushfire Appeal Fund was received in mid-December. The community from far and wide donated over \$360,000 with more than 98% benefiting those directly impacted. The remaining 2% supported the nonprofit organisation Re-green 4 Fire Aid, set up to assist with replanting trees, gardens, windbreaks and shelter belts.
