Stage 1: Twelve Apostles Trail Project

July 2022



Want to test out sections of the Twelve Apostles Trail before the official completion and opening?

The 16 km section of trail from Timboon to the Wannon Water treatment plant (opposite Gristede's farm) can now be used.

There are two bridges that still need to go in along the Curdievale Port Campbell Road and Timboon Peterborough Road section, so take care and follow the detour signs. The bridges are being fabricated off-site.

The section from the treatment plant to the Port Campbell town look-out should be completed in the next few weeks.

What's next?

We now turn our focus to the last two kilometres along the Great Ocean Road and into Port Campbell.

CivilNow has been appointed to build this final and more complex section. You may have seen work crews around Campbells Creek bridge looking at Telstra and Wannon Water services, as well as vegetation in the area.

There are more planning approvals to work through and community engagement to be done around the local Biolinks project and young vegetation that will be impacted in this area.

May 2020

Corangamite Shire commits \$2.22M to Stage 1 of the Twelve Apostles Trail in its 2020-2021 Budget.

August 2020

Victorian Government commits \$4.5M to the project.

January 2021-May 2022

Haywards Road to Curdievale Port Campbell Road completed.

March 2021-May 2022

Curdievale Port Campbell Road completed.

September 2021- June 2022

Glerums Road to Haywards Road completed.

May-August 2022

Great Ocean Road to look-out.

2022-2023

Look-out to Port Campbell.
