## Stage 1: Twelve Apostles Trail Project

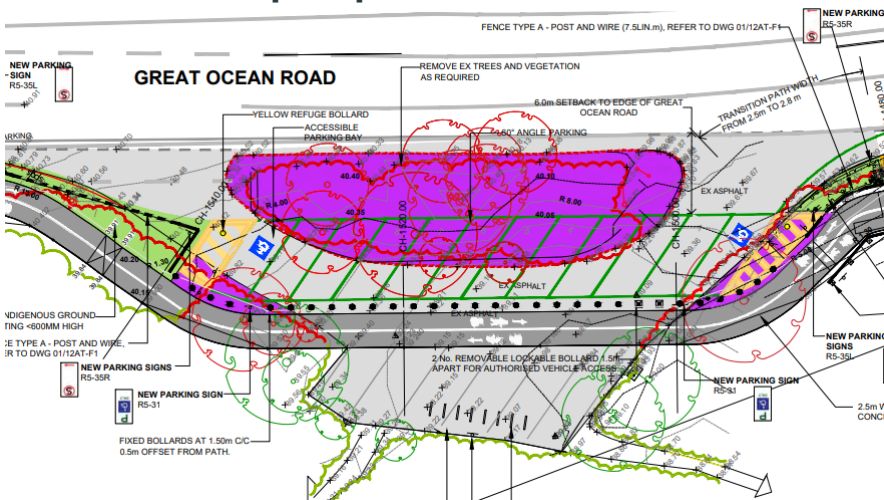

### What's happened since the last update?

- **Curdievale Port Campbell Road to Great Ocean Road lookout** is now 90% constructed. The section alongside the waste water treatment plant will receive a final layer and drainage works when weather is finer.
- **Great Ocean Road lookout carpark** Car park has been temporarily closed and set-out has started on this section of trail.
- **Lord Street** Set-out has started in preparation for works.
- **Port Campbell to Campbells Creek Bridge** Telstra infrastructure has been located. Design and trail alignment will be reviewed to minimise any potential damage.

### Additional projects

#### Paaratte Recreation Reserve

Eco-friendly toilet installation underway and shelter shed refurbishment almost complete.

#### Closing the Loop

Recycled plastic seats installed.

#### Cattle Underpass Bridges

Bridges are still being manufactured off-site and will be installed by the end of 2022.

### Project timeline

#### May 2020

Corangamite Shire commits \$2.22M to Stage 1 of the Twelve Apostles Trail in its 2020-2021 Budget.

#### August 2020

Victorian Government commits \$4.5M to the project.

#### July-December 2020

Power Creek Reserve Trail completed.

#### January 2021-May 2022

Haywards Road to Curdievale Port Campbell Road completed.

#### March 2021-May 2022

Curdievale Port Campbell Road completed.

#### September 2021-June 2022

Glerums Road to Haywards Road completed.

#### May-August 2022

Great Ocean Road to lookout.

#### October-December 2022

Great Ocean Road lookout carpark. Lord Street and two cattle underpass bridges to be installed.

#### October 2022-June 2023

Great Ocean Road lookout to Campbells Creek.

#### February-June 2023

Port Campbell to Campbells Creek.

#### April-June 2023

Campbells Creek pedestrian bridge
