Services in 2021

Introducing two years of kindergarten before school has had a big impact on Family and Children's Services. There are now 224 children enrolled in our kinder services: 93 first years (traditionally three-year-old kinder) and 131 second years (in the year before school). Days of operation have increased at the Timboon Kindergarten, Terang Children's Centre and at Western Plains Childcare.

With so many three-year-olds accessing kindergarten the impact on childcare and family day care has meant lower enrolments in some childcare settings and an increase in under-threes attending. Staffing has increased to accommodate the additional services and to meet the child/educator ratios.

After Kindergarten/After School (AKAS) care is operating five days a week in Timboon and Terang.

We now have a team of nearly 50 educators, not including the additional relief team members or Civic Centre team members. Two additional relief staff have completed their induction. This will help ensure that services continue to operate when staff members are unwell.

Emergency evacuation practice

Services have been practising emergency evacuation to familiarise staff and children in how to quickly and safely evacuate in an emergency.

Whether it's a service with 30-plus children or family day care educators who work alone, it is essential to have an evacuation plan to leave a premises safely and to practise under different circumstances in order to be prepared in the event a real emergency occurs.

Space and Solar Systems at Western Plains Kindergarten

The folk of Western Plains Kindergarten have immersed themselves in all things galaxy including stars, the emu in the sky and spaceships. Children were encouraged to discuss their knowledge about stars and asked to draw one. After watching this video the children plan to create their own emu in the sky.



Soapy Heroes and Gerry the Germ

Due to the ongoing pandemic the need to understand how germs work is essential. Simpson Kindergarten has been conducting experiments after watching this <u>video</u> to showcase how we and other people have germs and how we share them with one another.

A container was filled with soapy water and topped with pepper (representing germs). Children were then asked to put their finger in the container to see what would happen. When they pulled their finger out it was covered in pepper which showcased how easily germs can stick to our hands.

Another container was filled with water and topped with pepper. This time the pepper moved away from their finger when they put it in the water. This helps us to encourage children to wash their hands regularly to help keep the germs away.

Sunflowers are brightening up services and streets as part of the community recovery team's Sun Burst Corangamite sunflower project.


